#### Warragamba Dam

On Thursday 7 September 5/6M were treated to a day out at Warragamba Dam followed by a tree planting at a local reserve. This excursion was funded by Penrith City Council and NSW Water and we were one of only 7 schools to enjoy this experience in 2017. We were also extra lucky in our timing as we were at the dam on the one day of the year when they test the flood gates and release water over the spillway. We got to watch the water rush past which was equivalent to one Olympic swimming pool every 2 seconds. The students participated in water quality testing activities and gained insights into how NSW Water protects the quality of water in our taps. We were then transported from the dam to a local Penrith reserve to participate in tree planting activities. In just under 1 hour 5/6M worked really well as a team to plant and water 160 new plants to regenerate the habitat of the local reserve. The students greatly enjoyed the whole day with comments like "I wish we could do this every day!" and "Best excursion ever!"

All educators and council staff that we worked with on the day commented on the great behaviour and polite manners of our students. Well Done 5/6M!
