In weeks 3 and 4 over 70 students went to Penrith Pool each day for their swimming lessons. The students practised many life-saving swimming skills and learnt valuable water safety lessons from the daily talks. Here are some figures to show you the great progress that many students made over the 2 week period.

	Number of Students Day 1	Number of Students Day 10
Number of students that can swim 0-4 metres	29	2
Number of students that can swim 25metres+	3	42

Like any new skill, in order for the students to maintain their swimming ability, it is important that they continue to practise swimming regularly because 'if you don't use it, you lose it!'.

We are applying for an additional session for the mainstream students for next year so hopefully even more students will be able to improve their swimming abilities.




