Moroccan Cous Cous Salad

Ingredients

- 1 tablespoon of vegetable or chicken stock
- 1 quarter teaspoon of Moroccan spice 1 quarter teaspoon of olive oil
- 1 tablespoon of cous cous
- red, green, or yellow capsicum 5 to 10 sultanas
- 3 to 5 chickpeas
- Chopped parsley Chopped fresh mint

Instructions

- 1. Put 1 tablespoon of couscous into a small cup or bowl. Cover with a tablespoon of hot stock, a quarter teaspoon of oil and let it sit for five minutes.
- 2. Chop parsley, mint or any other herbs into fine, small pieces.
- 3. Wash and chop capsicum into small pieces.
- 4. Check sultanas for stalks and place to the side.
- 5. Rinse chick peas and place to the side.
- 6. When couscous has sat for five minutes mix with a fork to make it fluffy.
- 7. Add a quarter teaspoon of Moroccan spice, mix.
- 8. Add sultanas, chick peas, capsicum and herbs and mix through.
