Principal's Message

Dear Parents and Carers

National Reconciliation Week - National Reconciliation Week is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures, and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia. Reconciliation is a journey for all Australians – as individuals, families, communities, organisations and importantly as a nation. At the heart of this journey are relationships between the broader Australian community and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

Biggest Morning Tea – Thank you to Mrs Lindsay for organising our cupcake stall. Our staff spent their week cooking up a storm to deliver some special treats for the students. A wonderful example of how we can make an impact and help others in our community.

Labelling Items of Clothing and Lunchboxes – A big thank you to Mrs Lang and Mrs Bagnell for sorting through the enormous pile of lost property. It was noted that approximately 75% of the unclaimed items were not labelled with children's names and classes. Also worth noting, items of clothing purchased from the preloved clothing shop often have the name of former students on them. It is recommended that you label these items with YOUR child's name to avoid confusion.

Enrolling Now for 2023 – If you have a child commencing kindergarten in 2023, or if you know of anyone commencing school next year, we are taking enrolments now! Our comprehensive Kickstart to Kindy program runs throughout terms three and four.

Children's Crossing – We ask you to assist us in ensuring our students' and community's safety by adhering to the speed limit and giving way to pedestrians. Please discuss road safety with your children and the importance of utilising the children's crossing to ensure their safety on the roads. Please wait until the crossing supervisor has returned to the side of the road before crossing the pedestrian crossing.

Kiss and Drop – Stopping for more than two minutes in this area is illegal. Please adhere to all signage. *Illegal parking may result in fines or a loss of demerit points*

A Word from our Local Police:

ARE YOU SCHOOL SAFE – "Illegal parking around schools endangers children's lives". If you've heard the expression "it's only a matter of time until someone gets hurt" then you'll understand why it is important for EVERYONE to obey the road rules.

School opening and closing hours are busy times for pedestrians and vehicles outside the school. Park safely even if it means walking further to the school gate. Schools provide information in school newsletters and emails to promote safe behaviour and this includes parking legally during drop off and pick up times.

Always take extra care in 40km/h school zones, which operate on gazetted school days. Observe all parking signs. They are planned with children's safety in mind. Illegal parking around schools puts lives at risk. That's why Council and the Police take a 'zero tolerance' approach. Council Rangers, Parking Officers and Police regularly patrol schools across the Penrith LGA.

Parking in a No Parking area - means you can stop to drop off or pick up passengers for a MAXIMUM of 2 MINUTES. You must stay within 3 metres of the vehicle.

Parking in a No Stopping area - means you CANNOT stop in this area for ANY reason.



- You will only hear a ding if the school sends a push notification.
